Summer is here and we are into our third phase of treatment. You know our goal, as always, is to help make being outdoors as manageable as possible. With June being cooler and damp, getting into the warmer weather will put a new spin on treating, and of course let us know how good or bad things are going to be. As you know mosquitos will return, if we do not stay mission focused in managing them. We are only fighting a couple of the many species on PEI. As always and most importantly, we need your continued financially support. The program is funded 100% by contributions from community members. There is no external funding. Within the treatment area, we are asking \$120.00 per household. Management has been running well at previous pricing, but even with the reduced use of material, the material has increased in price. Belfast Historical Society (BHS)

Whose mandate is preserve, protect and promote the arts, culture, heritage and history of Big Belfast meets on the fourth Thursday of Sept, Oct, and November in the Croft House unless otherwise arranged. Everyone is always welcome; we have guest speakers most meetings; and shared lunch every meeting. Come for the fellowship!

The Croft House is open for the 2018 season Tuesday through Saturday from 9 to 5. Come hear the stories of Big Belfast - stories of the Mi'kmaq; the Pointe Prime Acadians; Lord Selkirk Settlers from 1803; the Irish Settlers of the mid-1800s; and of our newcomers since those early settlements. We have genealogical records for many Big Belfast families and would welcome receiving copies of yours if you wish to share with the many people who visit us to find their, your, our ancestors. The former Church of Scotland (moved from Belle River to Selkirk Park) is open during Croft House hours. There, you can find quiet respite. Story boards about Reverend MacDonald and "the MacDonaldites," and separately about the Acadians of 1750-1758 adorn the walls of this historic 1876 Church. Across the road, tour the ancient Acadian cemetery as you imagine Acadian life here on Belfast Cove. Find the cairn remembering the Acadians that tells of their deportation on the ill-fated *Duke William*. Significant history here!

The Honourable J. Angus MacLean woodland retreat is a lovely place to reflect upon his story of escaping war-torn Europe, his duty to his province and country politically, and especially his passion for rural Prince Edward Island. If you are looking for inspiration, take a minute or two near his cairn and his storyboard in the woods next to the Croft House.

Last year in response to the threat of a school closure, the Belfast Historical Society conceived and rolled out its community plan Big Belfast: A Rural Model Community which draws upon Vision and Leadership (as a legacy to Lord Selkirk's vision and leadership). This year begins the action years, we have been busy! "Big Belfast" is our BHS/community brand, if you will, and we have devised a framework that divides future action into bite-sized pieces within community pillars. Pillars include - but needn't be limited to: education; housing; business; arts, culture, history and heritage; fish, food, forage; energy and environment; health and wellness; and infrastructure. The BHS has taken on the arts, culture, heritage and history pillar as we move to house an art gallery and museum within a cultural centre. Others have stepped up to rally troops around other pillars. Thank you! The actions and outcomes depend upon community involvement. Out of Province Medical Travel Support Programs

You may not know; the Province presently operates four Out of Province Travel Support Programs. The program will provide financial support for eligible patients and/or their essential escorts traveling out of the province. This ensures travel is possible for all PEI residents who hold a valid PEI Health Card. Financial assistance is provided through subsidizing eligible applicants and their essential escorts' fare costs. Health PEI reviews all requests using eligibility criteria, based on total household income:

- 1. *Maritime Bus Program*: subsidizes the cost to Maritime Bus service destinations.
- Hope Air Flights Program: a national charity, to provide free commercial flights for eligible PEI residents to travel for medical services out-of-province, outside of the Maritimes.
- Hope Air Bridge Toll Program: subsidizes the cost of Confederation Bridge Toll passes for eligible PEI residents to travel for medical services out-of-province using a private vehicle.
- Hope Air Ferry Pass Program: subsidizes the cost of Northumberland Ferries Limited passes for eligible PEI residents to travel for medical services out-of-province using a private vehicle.
