September Update Pinette-Flat River-Roseberry Mosquito Program

We acknowledge that mosquitoes have invaded our yards, gardens and workplaces during the month of August. Unfortunately, as you may know, we are only fighting a couple of species of mosquitoes in the marsh areas which have tidal pools, and we treat when they are in the larva stage, with the product we purchase, before they become airborne.

There unfortunately are other species of mosquitoes out there, who have their own summer cycles, which are dependent on many contributing factors that trigger their presence, such as warmer weather, humidity, and amount of rain.

As mentioned, we are only fighting the species of mosquitoes in the tidal marsh areas. Other mosquito species may also develop in standing water around culverts along highways, and in storm water catch basins, eaves troughs, discarded tires, bird baths, ornamental pools, edges of swamps, shallow ponds, weedy margins of deeper ponds, and woodland pools as examples. Woodland pools are common sites for larval development. The team does not treat on any private property with our process.

For those along the tidal areas with the marsh and pools of standing water, we would like to think they would be much worse if we did not treat. They need the very high monthly tides that form the stagnate pools of water. Mosquitoes do not breed in moving water.

Our goal in this area, for what we are currently doing, is to keep the population as low as possible in the marsh areas we treat. Most people have reported higher than acceptable levels of mosquitoes around their homes. It is so hard to measure or quantify how well we are doing, with all the variables, but for those of us who can remember what the mosquitoes were like before our community program started, as bad as August may seem, it could be worse. The team will be treating again in September, with a plan for improved results

Out of Province Medical Travel Support Programs

The Province presently operates four Out of Province Travel Support Programs providing financial support for eligible patients and/or their essential escorts traveling out of the province. This ensures travel is possible for all PEI residents who hold a valid PEI Health Card. Financial assistance is provided through subsidizing eligible applicants and their essential escorts' fare costs. Health PEI reviews all requests using eligibility criteria, based on total household income:

- 1. *Maritime Bus Program*: subsidizes the cost to Maritime Bus service destinations.
- 2. *Hope Air Flights Program*: a national charity, to provide free commercial flights for eligible PEI residents to travel for medical services out-of-province, outside of the Maritimes.
- 3. Hope Air Bridge Toll Program: subsidizes the cost of Confederation Bridge Toll passes for eligible PEI residents to travel for medical services out-of-province using a private vehicle.
- Hope Air Ferry Pass Program: subsidizes the cost of Northumberland Ferries Limited passes for eligible PEI residents to travel for medical services out-of-province using a private vehicle.


