Belfast Historical Society (BHS)

Blueberry sundaes were our fundraiser this year at the Highland Games and as a treat after the Church service.

There's a new entranceway at the Acadian Cemetery to welcome many more visitors.

Thursday night, Sept. 20th was the regular meeting of the BHS. We observed a moment of silence in respect for Isabel MacDonald and Kaye Furness, two long time members and supporters who we've lost this year and also for the two missing fishers.

Financially, this season at the Croft House is well behind last year's. Linda Nobles' interest in dinosaurs began as a kid. But she began her hobby with adventures in Florida, searching dark water rivers for shark and crocodile teeth. She showed us a megalodon tooth: it was 20 million years old. Then she discovered Paleo Prospectors. http://www.paleoprospectors.com, an organization for those interested in palaeontology so everyday people can hunt for dinosaur bones. If they find T-Rex teeth, they sell for \$8 - \$10 million dollars.

Chris Ruprecht is a paleo-artist from Charlottetown and brought us a model of a Compsugnathus, a 45 cm/18" high, three-toed dinosaur. He considers this dinosaur to be the first of three sculptures.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK OCTOBER 7th - 13th, 2018

Seconds can mean the difference between a safe escape or tragedy. This year's theme, "Look. Listen. Learn. - Be Aware. Fire can be Anywhere" puts an important emphasis on why everyone needs to have an escape plan.

- Draw a map of the home with all household members, making two exits from each room and a path to the outside from each exit.
- Practice a home fire drill twice a year. Conduct one at night and one during the day with everyone in the home and practice using different ways out.
- Teach children how to escape on their own in case a dults can't help them.
- Make sure the civic number is clearly visible, preferably double-sided signs, so the fire department can find you.
- Close doors behind you as you leave this may slow the spread of smoke, heat and fire.
- Once you get outside, stay outside. Never go back inside a burning building.
