Christmas Bird Count (CBC) Around Belfast, December 26th

Each year, a group of around 5 people go around Belfast to count birds on what's known as the Christmas Bird Count. The Belfast area is #8 in what's called the Hillsborough Count for Nature PEI and the Audubon Society which keeps the statistics each year. Some readers of this Newsletter will know about this event and contribute sightings each year. On December 26th, 2018, five of us (including Liz Townsend from Belfast) saw 25 species. There were certainly more birds out there, but we spent 9 hours looking up and down the roads South of the TCH from Halliday's Wharf to the Pinette Bridge. Here's the list of those we saw on a very cold but lovely sunny day. Canada Goose - 703, Long Tailed Duck - 55, Common Merganser - 6, Red Breasted Merganser - 233, Black Duck - 150, Herring Gull - 8, Greater Black Backed Gull - 6, Iceland Gull - 3, Red Tail Hawk - 1, Eagles - 3 mature, 1 immature, Snowy Owl - seen on the 24, 25 near the Pt Prim Lighthouse, Rock Dove - 45, Mourning Dove - 9, Pileated Woodpecker - Feeding daily on old spruce leaving chips, bird still not sighted, Flicker - 1, Red Breasted Nuthatch - 5, Starling - 154, Junco -22, Snow Bunting - 25, American Goldfinch - 37, American Tree Sparrow - 1, Black Capped Chickadee - 50, Crow - 156, Raven - 3, Red Bellied Woodpecker - 1, a birder at Point Prim early in the day picked up some type of loon., common goldeneye, Imore Red-breasted Mergansers (942), some Black Scoter and a Merlin. In November 2018, approximately 120 local residents were sent a flyer regarding the possibility of restarting a biting fly program in Mt. Buchanan - Point Prim area. This was to establish level of interest, support and willingness to move the program forward.

To date we have received 30 replies all positive plus a few more affirmative verbal replies from local residents and summer residents. If you have contact addresses for any summer residents please forward this information on to them for their input. Thank you.

Two companies have indicated interest in carrying out the program in our districts pending more information. Out of Province Medical Travel Support Programs

You may not know; the Province presently operates four Out of Province Travel Support Programs. The program will provide financial support for eligible patients and/or their essential escorts traveling out of the province. This ensures travel is possible for all PEI residents who hold a valid PEI Health Card. Financial assistance is provided through subsidizing eligible applicants and their essential escorts' fare costs. Health PEI reviews all requests using eligibility criteria, based on total household income:

- 1. *Maritime Bus Program*: subsidizes the cost to Maritime Bus service destinations.
- 2. *Hope Air Flights Program*: a national charity, to provide free commercial flights for eligible PEI residents to travel for medical services out-of-province, outside of the Maritimes.
- 3. *Hope Air Bridge Toll Program:* subsidizes the cost of, Bridge Toll passes for eligible PEI residents to travel for medical services out-of-province using a private vehicle.
- 4. Hope Air Ferry Pass Program: subsidizes the cost of Northumberland Ferries Limited passes for eligible PEI residents to travel for medical services out-of-province using a private vehicle.

Included in our Big Belfast plans is a new Arts and Cultural Centre which will include a new gallery to house the recently acquired Elinor Murchison Gillis historical and folk-art collections. The need for Housing remains a focus of discussions. The Health and Wellness pillar has sparked some great conversations recently: CPR/First Aid; exercise classes, and mosquito control. Details—and actions— are community driven. Thanks to all those who have contacted the BHS and are stepping up.
