BAWG – Sustaining the Growth

The Belfast Area Watershed Group (BAWG) started operations in 2017. Our total revenue for that year was a little over \$33,000. Since then, we have grown to the point that last year we were able to provide environmental employment to 8 young people in the Belfast area.

We depend on both government grants and community support to fund these activities. Like many successful valuesbased, not-for-profit charities, grant funding covers about 80-90% of our operating expenses. Most grant funding is tied to specific projects and/or salaries. What is much harder to do is raise funds for our core operations - those activities that keep an organization running, such as Workers Compensation fees and standard office/business operations. We rely on community fundraising and personal donations to make up the difference and enable us to achieve all our priorities.

This is where we would like your help. As was posted in the December Newsletter, you can now receive a charitable donation receipt for any donations by making them through the Community Foundation of PEI. There are various ways to donate to the Foundation; CanadaHelps, or direct e-transfer to info@cfpei.ca, or a cheque with reference to BAWG. Pinette / Flat River Mosquito Control

Entering a new era Partnership with BCDC!

For the past 8 years a dedicated group of volunteers have done all the work involved in running this program for the benefit of the community. This includes fund raising, monitoring marshes for larval hatches and treating with an organic control product (Vectobac) as required. Maintaining this level of effort on an on-going basis is proving difficult as the number of licensed volunteers declines.

The negative impact of mosquitoes on both our quality of life and the economic well-being of the community is well known. We are extremely pleased to announce that starting this year we are entering a partnership with the Belfast Community Development Corporation (BCDC) to work together on this control program. Volunteers with the program will continue to do the regular monitoring of the marshes and will assist with treatments, but BCDC will have a core group of licensed staff who will be able to carry out treatments when required. The mosquito control program will compensate BCDC for time spent on this activity. Without this partnership, the program would have ceased to exist.

Of course, this means we need to raise more funds than we required for the last few years. If we can get the number of donors back up to where it was when the program started, we will be in good financial shape. If you live in the region surrounding the Pinette and Flat Rivers, please contribute to the program (\$125 per household) and encourage your neighbours to do so too. Out of Province Medical Travel Support Programs

The PEI Government offers financial support for PEI residents travelling to another province for medical services. The Out-of-Province Travel Support Program includes:

Maritime Bus Program

 Islanders requiring out-of-province health care in Nova Scotia or New Brunswick may qualify for fare subsidy to travel with Maritime Bus.

Hope Air - Flights Program

 Since 1988, Prince Edward Island has partnered with Hope Air, a national charity, to provide free flights to PEI residents who cannot afford the cost of a commercial airline ticket for travel to medical services in another province.

Hope Air - Bridge/Ferry Program

 Beginning December 1, 2016, Hope Air, in cooperation with Health PEI, will subsidize the cost of a Confederation Bridge or Northumberland Ferry pass for pre-approved PEI residents (with a valid PEI Health Card) requiring out-of-province transport by private vehicle for medical services in another province.




