Vernon River / Belfast Community Pantry Update:

A meeting was held at the Uigg Community Center on Sunday, April 2nd, with a good attendance of about 20 people. Bonnie Shave was introduced as the new Vernon River / Belfast Community Pantry Co Ordinator.

The Community Pantry has set up an e-mail address: communitypantry2022@gmail.com, Also, Bonnie's phone number is 902-969-4850.

Our Pantry is open 24/7 and currently seems to be used by approximately 20 families. During April, the St. Joachim's CWL took on the role of helpers. Their help was greatly appreciated! Vernon River Lions Club have stepped up to lend an extra hand during May.

As Pantry helpers/members:

- 1. help stock the shelves via meeting roll call and/or from member Pantry drop off donations
- 2. appoint members to visit the Pantry at least 3 times a week, more if membership allows to:
 - a. do a quick visual of stock (if the Pantry is exceptionally low on stock then advise Pantry Coordinator)
 - b. do a quick visual of expiry dates
 - c. discard any spoiled fruit or vegetables, etc.
 - d. check temperature of fridge and freezer
 - e. report any sign of vandalism or damage
 - f. report any other concerns that you may have

The Pantry has received a couple generous monetary donations recently. One from the St. John's Presbyterian Church in Belfast, and one from the Vernon River Lions Club, which were greatly appreciated. We also received a \$2,300.00 grant from the Rural Municipality of Belfast, from their 2023/2024 Community Grants Funding. This funding will be used to help maintain stock during low times.

It's heartwarming to see such generous support from our community in keeping the Pantry stocked and maintained.

Monetary donations may be e-transferred to our Pantry e-mail address, communitypantry2022@gmail.com, or dropped off at the office at G. Visser & Sons Potato building, next to the Pantry. Monetary donations are used to purchase food when our stock is depleted.

Father-daughter duo Donnell and Mary Frances Leahy keep the Celtic caper legacy alive and display their award-winning talents, while rising star and Celtic-Mi'kmaq fiddler, Morgan Toney returns to Small Halls with Keith Mullins.

Mary Frances Leahy is a fiddler, pianist, dancer, and composer. Out of Province Medical Travel Support Programs

The PEI Government offers financial support for PEI residents travelling to another province for medical services. The Out-of-Province Travel Support Program includes:

Maritime Bus Program

- Islanders requiring out-of-province health care in Nova Scotia or New Brunswick may qualify for fare subsidy to travel with Maritime Bus.

Hope Air - Flights Program

 Since 1988, Prince Edward Island has partnered with Hope Air, a national charity, to provide free flights to PEI residents who cannot afford the cost of a commercial airline ticket for travel to medical services in another province.

Hope Air - Bridge/Ferry Program

- Beginning December 1, 2016, Hope Air, in cooperation with Health PEI, will subsidize the cost of a Confederation Bridge or Northumberland Ferry pass for pre-approved PEI residents (with a valid PEI Health Card) requiring out-of-province transport by private vehicle for medical services in another province.

Notice from the Belfast Fire Department

You can call 1-800-237-5053 to find out about the current burning restrictions in place for the province of PEI. This number can be accessed 24 hours a day; 7 days a week.




