<u>Pinette/Flat River Mosquito Program – Partnering with BCDC</u>

The partnership between the Pinette/Flat River mosquito control program and BCDC continues to move forward, although it will have limited impact on treatments this year.

Troy MacNeil of BCDC will be leading the program starting next year. Troy is currently working on his biting fly pesticide applicators license (PAL). Later this year BCDC will identify at least 3 more employees who will undertake to obtain their PAL over the fall and winter so they will be ready to go as soon as the program starts up in the spring.

For this year, the program will continue to be operated by the committed group of volunteers who have operated the program for the last 8 years. All financial contributions made this year which are in excess of our actual costs will be held over and applied to next year's program.

So far, things seem to be going well in this region. Let's hope we can keep it that way!

Community Presentation - Watercourse and shoreline regulations (buffer zones, riparian areas, shorelands) Join us on July 27th (7:00pm) at Wood Islands Market (upstairs hall) as we welcome guest speaker Shawn Hill. Mr. Hill is Environment Officer/ALUS Coordinator with Environment, Energy and Climate Action, Environmental Land Management for the province of PEI. They will be discussing the regulations around watercourses, including buffer zones and shorelands. This is an important topic, and any activity that happens in watercourses and along buffer zones affects wildlife habitat, downstream habitat, and landowners - with regulations and permits required. Be in the know and help us protect our watersheds.

Beach Clean-up with BAWG. We will be conducting more beach clean-ups this season and need your help. If you have an accessible beach-front/shoreline, please let us know. This will aid not only in reaching additional areas for clean-up, but in removal of larger debris, such as ghost gear - rope, barrels, nets, foam, and buoys. Notice from the Belfast Fire Department

Required rules for burning debris have changed.

Fire season runs from March 15th to November 30th. There are new rules and categories that must be followed. Heavy fines can and will be given.

You can call 1-800-237-5053 to find out about the current burning restrictions in place for the province of PEI. This number can be accessed 24 hours a day; 7 days a week.

For detailed information, please visit our website at <u>princeedwardisland.ca/fireinformation</u> and be aware that there is no burning allowed between 8:00am and 2:00pm. There are 4 categories and a map that details when, and if, burning is allowed.

Out of Province Medical Travel Support Programs

The PEI Government offers financial support for PEI residents travelling to another province for medical services. The Out-of-Province Travel Support Program includes:

Maritime Bus Program

- Islanders requiring out-of-province health care in Nova Scotia or New Brunswick may qualify for fare subsidy to travel with Maritime Bus.

Hope Air - Flights Program

 Since 1988, Prince Edward Island has partnered with Hope Air, a national charity, to provide free flights to PEI residents who cannot afford the cost of a commercial airline ticket for travel to medical services in another province.

Hope Air - Bridge/Ferry Program

- Beginning December 1, 2016, Hope Air, in cooperation with Health PEI, will subsidize the cost of a Confederation Bridge or Northumberland Ferry pass for pre-approved PEI residents (with a valid PEI Health Card) requiring out-of-province transport by private vehicle for medical services in another province.


